The Childcare Aide is responsible for assisting in the childcare program day to day operation by; providing, supervising, caring for and maintaining a safe and healthy curriculum based learning environment for children ages 0-12 years of age.

DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

The following duties are not intended to serve as a comprehensive list of all duties in this classification. Shown are duties intended to provide a representative summary or the major duties and responsibilities. The Childcare Aide may not be required to perform all duties listed and may be required to perform additional, positions specific duties:

- Assist staff with both long and short range activities in accordance with curriculum objectives, developmentally appropriate practice and program philosophy
- Maintain daily communication with parents
- Maintain confidentiality
- Report any suspected abuse to supervisor
- Document accidental reports
- Arrange a classroom environment in accordance to program goals and philosophy

- Attend required trainings
- Keep all appropriate documents such as records, attendance and time sheets
- Meet applicable licensing regulations
- Perform other duties as assigned

Necessary Skills and Knowledge

- Ability to maintain a regular attendance and be reliable and punctual
- Ability to speak, write, listen and communicate effectively, meet and deal effectively with general public
- Establish and maintain cooperative working relationships and demonstrate effective leadership
- Ability to maintain positive and professional relationships with families
- Knowledge of early childhood theories, practices and culturally responsive care
- Familiarity with Alaska Native culture and other diverse backgrounds
- Ability to bend, lift and carry up to 40 lbs. or stoop to assist a child
- Perform other duties as assigned

Minimum Qualifications (education, experience, skills)

- High School Diploma or GED
- Must be 18 years of age
- Excellent interpersonal communication skills
- Commitment to working with children in a developmental setting and a sincere desire to have a meaningful effect on their lives
- Obtain First Aid/CPR Certification within 6 months of hire
- Obtain Health and Safety Training
- Obtain Mandated Reporter Training
- Obtain OSHA Blood Borne Pathogen Certification within 1 year of hire
- Documentation that the individual is free from active Tuberculosis
- Ability to successfully pass finger print check, sex offenders check and any other background check
