UPDATE Covid-19 Test Reports 07/27/2020

TOTAL 5 POSITIVE COVID-19

Yakutat Incident Command received confirmation from Yakutat Community Health Center (YCHC) that Yakutat stands at 5 total Positive Covid-19 individuals in town. There are 4 Residents and 1 Nonresident. YCHC was informed by the State of Alaska today July 27 that there were no further Positive Covid-19 cases reported of the analyzed tests that were completed. The State is continuing the analysis of the remaining tests in their position. Those Covid-19 positive individuals have a State of Alaska case worker and are required to stay isolated during this time. Those determined to be in direct contact with a Positive Covid-19 individual have State Guidelines to follow to Self-Quarantine and monitor themselves. A person that has tested positive or determined to be a close contact cannot have contact with anyone within six feet other than other household members that are quarantined with them.

YCHC will be conducting a Drive Thru Covid-19 Testing on Monday July 27, 2020 between 1- 3 pm today July 27.

If anyone is showing signs and symptoms of Covid 19 call the Covid Hotline at 784-3010 during YCHC business hours. Otherwise self-quarantine and contact YCHC for directions of how they will address your needs. If you are in need of immediate medical attention please call 911 and inform the person answering the phone that it may be Covid related. Any person that is positive Covid-19 or has had direct contact with a positive Covid-19 patient: **WILL BE REQUIRED TO FOLLOW THE CDC & STATE OF ALASKA GUIDELINES. TESTING AND QUARANTINE UNTIL RESULTS OR SELF QUARANTINE FOR UP TO 14 DAYS** or any other guideline requiring a longer isolation. You can find information at covid19@alaska.gov.
