POSITION SUMMARY

Responsible for performing a variety of trail maintenance duties on Yakutat Tlingit Tribe's Projects and associated with the U.S Forest Service.

ESSENTIAL DUTIES AND RESPONSIBILITIES

- The position is part time
- Extensive hiking, working in uneasy weather conditions, hot, humid to wet and cold
- Work will include restoring trails, hardened stream crossings & other duties as directed
- Work requires stooping, lifting, reaching, bending, carrying, and repetitive motion
- Exposure to long periods of insects, motor noise, exhaust, in the outdoors is possible
- Use of any gasoline-operated power tool/equipment
- Work will occur across uneven terrain, including hills, slopes, grades, and wetlands in both forested and open areas
- Work conditions will provide numerous slipping and tripping hazards such as rocks and tree roots, mossy stones or logs, mud and water, or loose gravel

- Small equipment experience both for operation and maintenance preferred
